LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

Cornwall is packed to the rafters with beautiful, brilliant and breath-taking days out for all ages and interests. From world-class gardens to wonderful historic castles, mines and stately homes; while galleries such as Tate St Ives and the mighty Eden Project are real showstoppers.

Trebah Garden

Under 1 mile from Budock Vean.

Experience the magic of this sub-tropical Cornish garden, steeped in heritage, creativity and the spirit of innovation. Glendurgan Gardens

Approx 1 mile

Stroll down through the peaceful valley to a sheltered beach at the bottom. Three valleys join into one at Glendurgan, where a beautiful and intriguing blend of exotic and native plants thrive. For opening times please visit Glendurgan's website.

GREAT WALKS NEAR US

Rosemullion Head Circular Walk

Distance: 5.8 miles | Easy – moderate | Dog-friendly

This circular walk starts at the ever popular Maenporth beach and then follows the coast to the entrance to the Helford River. It is a peaceful route that traces the edge of Rosemullion Head, a stunning promontory jutting out into the bay offering expansive views.

Helford Passage Circular Walk

Distance: 6.3 miles | Moderate

This walk loops around the grounds of Budock Vean and takes you to some of the more hidden pathways and the lanes less travelled. You'll pass the farmstead of Bosveal to the oldieworldie creek-side hamlet of Durgan, Glendurgan, Trebah Garden and Port Navas Creek.

Discover Frenchman's Creek Circular Walk

Distance: 3.8 miles | Moderate

Helford village itself was once notorious for smuggling and piracy but today is a picture perfect place to explore. After passing through the village the route follows the valley from Penarvon to a tiny chapel before descending to Frenchman's Creek, a peaceful finger of water made famous by Daphne du Maurier.
